

Derby Safeguarding Adults Board (DSAB) Safeguarding Adults Review (SAR) Criteria Document (Section 44 Care act 2014)

- (1) A Safeguarding Adult Board (SAB) must arrange for there to be a review of a case involving an adult in its area with needs for care and support (whether or not the local authority has been meeting any of those needs) if:
 - a) there is reasonable cause for concern about how the SAB, members of it or other persons with relevant functions worked together to safeguard the adult and
 - b) either of the following conditions are met
- (2) Condition 1 is met if:
 - a) The adult has died, and
 - b) The SAB knows or suspects that the death resulted from abuse or neglect (whether or not it knew about or suspected the abuse or neglect before the adult died)
- (3) Condition 2 is met if:
 - a) The adult is still alive, and
 - b) The SAB knows or suspects that the adult has experienced serious abuse or neglect

Each member of the SAB must co-operate in and contribute to the carrying out of the review with a view to:

- c) identifying the lessons to be learnt from the adult's case, and
- d) applying those lessons to future cases
